





Tips for Being More Social on Your Own Terms

Being more social isn't about pleasing everyone around you. Seriously. There's nothing wrong with chilling at home and binge-watching your favorite show after a long week.

Putting yourself out there can look different for everyone. Maybe for you, it's about hanging with some of your closest pals or chatting it up with the pizza delivery guy.

Here's a look at 10 tips to help you better connect with others. If some of these tips aren't the right fit, feel free to ditch them altogether and try something else. What's important is that you find the joy in connecting.

Make sure you're doing it for the right reasons. First thing's first,

there's no right way to put yourself out there. It's OK if you're not into hitting the club every other night or accepting all those Facebook event invites. More than anything, you're under no obligation to fulfill other people's expectations, and this includes how you spend your time. Pay attention to your gut reaction here. While feeling close to others has its benefits, it's important to go about it on our own terms and in a way that feels psychologically nurturing to you.

You have to be a good listener. We all like to feel seen and heard. One of the best and undervalued ways of connecting with others is by thoughtfully listening to what they have to say. You can practice listening by being

curious and seeking to understand where the other person is coming from.

Avoid interrupting them mid-story or talking over them when they answer a question. Instead, offer your undivided attention and genuine interest. Try to ask follow-up questions where they feel natural to show that you're listening carefully to what they're saying. When listening, keep these questions in mind: What's important to this person? What are they excited to share? What do they value?

Give compliments freely. When in doubt, say something kind. The right words at the right time can make someone's day significantly better and also open the door to a

conversation. Studies show that by doing so, we also increase our own life satisfaction. Telling a co-worker, you enjoyed their presentation or letting someone know how much you like their shirt is a great way to connect. But make sure you're being sincere to avoid appearing disingenuous.

Here are a few steps for paying someone a compliment: Pay attention to what you genuinely like about a person so that you'll really mean what you say. Don't be obvious. Notice the small things that make someone unique so that your words stand out. Avoid platitudes or clichés. Don't say the same thing to everyone or compliment their physical appearance. Instead, focus on personality qualities or quirks.

Also get involved. If you're ready to take a bigger step toward putting yourself out there, consider finding a hobby that is social, such as volunteering at a nonprofit. This is also a great way of giving back and being of service. Participating in activities you enjoy can help alleviate feelings of inadequacy when meeting new people, especially if you've just moved to a new community.

Plus, you already know of at least one thing you'll have in common with others there, whether that be a love of gardening, a soft spot for

animals, or a passion for social justice.

Chat with strangers. There's nothing like getting to know those around you to make you feel like you're part of a community. For one, it gives you a sense of belonging. It also gives you an opportunity to turn acquaintances into closer friends. Start up a spontaneous conversation with your barista the next time you're ordering your latte, or ask your neighbor how her day is going.


While seemingly casual, one 2014 study found that interacting with a wide network of people on a daily basis contributes to your well-being.

At last, recognize when you might need help. Human connection is an important part of your overall well-being, but it isn't always easy. Keep in mind that developing your social skills is a gradual process that won't happen overnight. Don't judge yourself if you aren't making as much progress as you'd like.

It's normal to experience some nervousness when you put yourself out there, but if you feel inhibited by your shyness or that it's preventing you from socializing, it may be time to talk to someone about potential underlying mental health concerns, such as social anxiety, agoraphobia, or generalized anxiety disorder.

Gwamba, Fredokiss postpone Fill Up shows

Two local rap heavyweights have suspended their plans to hold musical concerts at the country's biggest stadiums.

Dubbed Fill Up shows, Fredokiss was scheduled to fill Kamuzu Stadium in Blantyre on March 28 while Gwamba was eyeing Bingu National Stadium in Lilongwe on a date to be announced.

However, the two shows have been put on hold due to Covid-19, both Gwamba and Fredokiss have confirmed.

Gwamba: We will wait for the Covid-19 to die down “With this whole corona thing, I want everything to settle down first then I proceed with the shows. I don’t want a scenario where I have set a date and start investing in the show then end up postponing,” he said.

Gwamba claimed that for the Mzuzu Stadium show, he spent about K9 million on billboards and deposits for almost everything, but ended up postponing the event.

“So, we will wait for the Covid-19 to die down, then will start with shows,” he said.

On plans to do more Facebook live shows as he did recently with a Sorry for Covid gig, the award-winning artist asked fans to watch out.

“I’m planning something big very soon,” Gwamba said without giving more details.


Fredokiss, on the other hand, asked his fans to be hopeful beyond the Covid challenges.

“See us making history. You see, God doing the impossible through us. See victory in despair. See yourself being part of a generation that is making history,” said the Malamulo a mu Ghetto hitmaker. He said his team has put all promotional activities on hold until they are sure of the dates.

“The stadium manager also communicated on the same. Our Fill Up Kamuzu Stadium show is still on but with Covid-19 issues, we are not doing promos because if things don’t change soon, we can change the dates.

“As soon as gatherings are allowed, we will definitely fill up Kamuzu Stadium,” he said.

The two musical concerts were billed to be among the big events in the first half of 2021.




Don't fear failure.



Innovation requires risk—and risk means there is a chance of failure. Not every idea works, and especially on the first attempt. The Juventus star's goalscoring run is unmatched across Europe's top-five leagues. Cristiano Ronaldo continued to raise the bar on Tuesday as he fired Juventus to a 3-0 win over Spezia. The Portuguese goalscorer was joined on the scoresheet by Alvaro Morata and Federico Chiesa as Juve ran rampant as they looked to keep pace in the Serie A title race. And, with his 83rd-minute goal, Ronaldo made history once again as one of the game's greatest-ever goalscorers.



When is the Champions League quarter-final draw? How to watch, time & teams for 2020-21 knockouts

All the details about the draw as Giorgio Marchetti and Co. at UEFA headquarters will soon be warming up the balls. The 2020-21 edition of the Champions League has entered the business end of the competition and there is very little room for error in the knockout rounds. Sixteen teams emerged from the group stage and they will soon be whittled down as the quest to be crowned European kings goes on.

Here, VIEWS MAGAZINE brings you what you need to know about the quarter-final draw, especially when it is.

The Champions League quarter-final draw will take place on Friday March 19, 2021 and it will begin at 11am GMT (6am ET). As is customary, the draw will be held at the House of European Football at UEFA's headquarters in Nyon, Switzerland.

Chelsea's Haaland pursuit casts shadow over Abraham & Giroud's battle for No.9 shirt

The Blues duo may both have a big decision to make this summer, if the club goes all out to land the most coveted young forward in football right now. Chelsea's interest in signing Borussia Dortmund superstar Erling Haaland may be exciting for supporters but it only creates further uncertainty in the minds of the club's current strikers. Olivier Giroud, for example, was the Blues matchwinner in Tuesday's Champions League clash with Atletico Madrid in Bucharest. His acrobatic overhead kick secured a deserved 1-0 victory that puts Thomas Tuchel's side in an excellent position ahead of a second leg at Stamford Bridge on March 17. However, the 34-year-old has now entered the final five months of his contract but is unwilling to discuss a renewal until the end of the season. And it's easy to understand why.

Flames Technical panel has suspended striker Hassan Kajoke for violating the team's code of conduct and COVID -19 camping protocols when he left camp without consent.

"The reason for the suspension is that, on the evening of Sunday, 28th February, 2021, the player left the training camp at Mpira Village in Chiwembe for home without the consent of the team manager and or head coach.

"It's our wish as Malawian company and it is our responsibility to return what people gives us. We help many people like orphans and others as part of corporate social responsibility. Lastly, we want to thank all Malawians for supporting their own Malawian company," said Kujaliwa.

Killy Msuku, one of the International tournament organizers, said they are delighted with the sponsorship from Fisd and promised that the money will go toward prize presentations.
